Cervical AI technique brought to New Zealand by the
Norwegian Association of Sheep and Goat Breeders

Always thought that AI in sheep is complicated and costly?
Come and learn how sheep farmers in Norway AI their sheep.

The Norwegian Association of Sheep and Goat Breeders are bringing their successful AI technique called “Shot in the Dark” to New Zealand. Norwegian farmers have been using this technique for many years inseminating 33,000 ewes per year, 98% of them with frozen semen and achieving pregnancy rates of 70% on average, without the use of drugs!
